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## “Student Pedagogues and Documenting Learning: Creating an Intentional Classroom Through Reggio Emilia Techniques”

The Reggio Emilia Approach to Learning was adopted following fascism in Italy in order to foster community, creativity, and free thinking. The method’s main goals are to promote democracy in the classroom, uphold student rights, document learning, ask questions and share materials to explore student interests at deeper levels, and engage with the outside community. The approach requires that teachers meet weekly with a pedagogy specialist to examine student work, ideas, and questions, in order to uncover and follow student interests in an intentional manner, while also accomplishing the pedagogical goals of the class. This workshop will talk about how to utilize student pedagogues to create a classroom that is dynamic, intentional, and meaningfully engaged with the Emory and Atlanta communities.
