In this session, Dr. Tamasi will introduce Emory's Global Internships Program and its corresponding academic component, Ling 343, "Intercultural Discourses." Simultaneous to their internships in one of twelve global cities, students are taught the topics of applied linguistics, discourse analysis, and ethnographic field methods. Through a series of readings, online discussions, and assignments, students view their host cities and their office spaces as new cultures. They are asked to reflect on the various types of communication in these contexts as well as the norms that govern them. Dr. Tamasi will also share feedback from students regarding this program and whether they see the course as an integrated and beneficial part of their internship experience. Plenty of time will be left for questions and open discussion.
